When fear tests our faith

Esther 4, page 398

- I. <u>FEAR</u>: MORDECAI URGED ESTHER TO BEG XERXES TO STOP HAMAN'S PLOT TO KILL ALL JEWS (ESTHER 4:1-8).
 - A. Mordecai and all Jews were terrified by Haman's plot (1-3).
 - B. When Mordecai was in sackcloth, Esther initially just sent new clothes, but when he rejected them she asked why (4-5).
 - C. Mordecai messaged Esther about Haman's plot and urged her to approach Xerxes to plead for the Jew's survival (6-8).
 - Desperation is the first step toward growing our faith.
- II. <u>FAITH</u>: ESTHER STRUGGLED WITH THE RISK, BUT ASKED JEWS TO FAST, THEN SHE WOULD GO (ESTHER 4:9-12).
 - A. Esther told Mordecai that approaching the king uninvited would risk her life (9-12).
 - B. Mordecai challenged Esther that maybe God made her queen "for such a time as this" (13-14).
 - 1. "Esther, your life is in danger whether you help or not" (13).
 - 2. "God will deliver us another way if you don't help" (14a).
 - 3. "Maybe God made you queen to help deliver us" (14b).
 - To <u>not</u> trust God is more dangerous than trusting God.
 - God doesn't need us to achieve His will, but longs to use us.
 - C. Esther asked the Jews to fast (includes prayer) because she had decided to go to the king in spite of the risk (15-17).
 - Faith grows best as we trust God alongside other believers.
